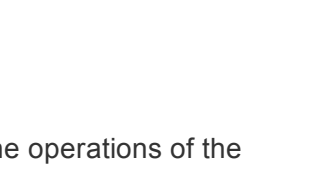
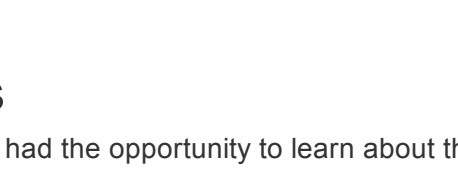
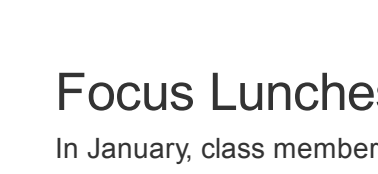
January was focused on communication and community investment. Class members learned about effective communication tools, participated in a news media simulation, and learned about fundraising best practices.

YLT started their day in January at their partner nonprofits and spent the remainder of the day hearing from healthcare leaders and touring medical facilities in Hall County. The first stop was at Central Community College. YLT students toured campus, spending a majority of the time touring the nursing, EMT, and paramedic teaching areas of the school. Students also heard from instructors and staff on the opportunities for getting started in the medical field right in our area. Then, YLT students heard from Dr. Tiffani Arndt, the Chief Nursing Officer at the Grand Island Regional Medical Center. She provided the students with insights into getting started in the medical field, characteristics needed in healthcare leadership, and opportunities for young people to get experience early. Then, Dr. Arndt and Dr. Lindsey Nielson, Director of Clinical Services, led tours of the new hospital. It was an exciting day, particularly because so many of this year's YLT students are interested in careers in healthcare. Maybe one of them will care for you down the road. Students also played a fun communication game to highlight the importance of getting your point across, an important lesson in the healthcare field and beyond.

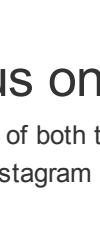

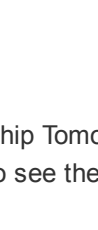
