

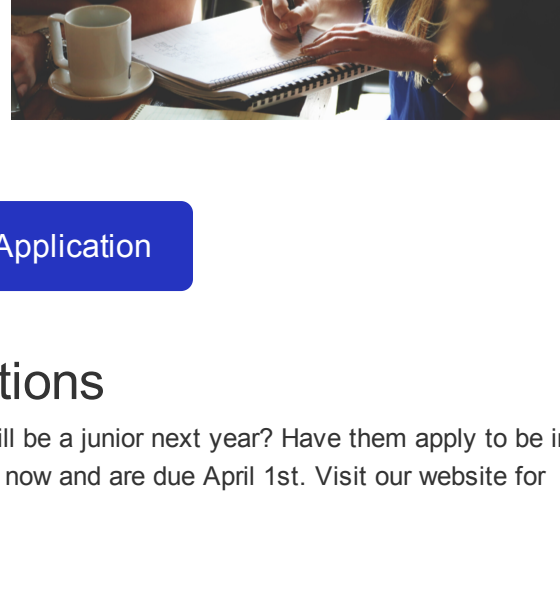

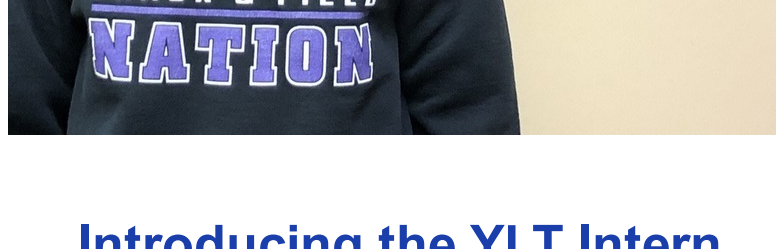

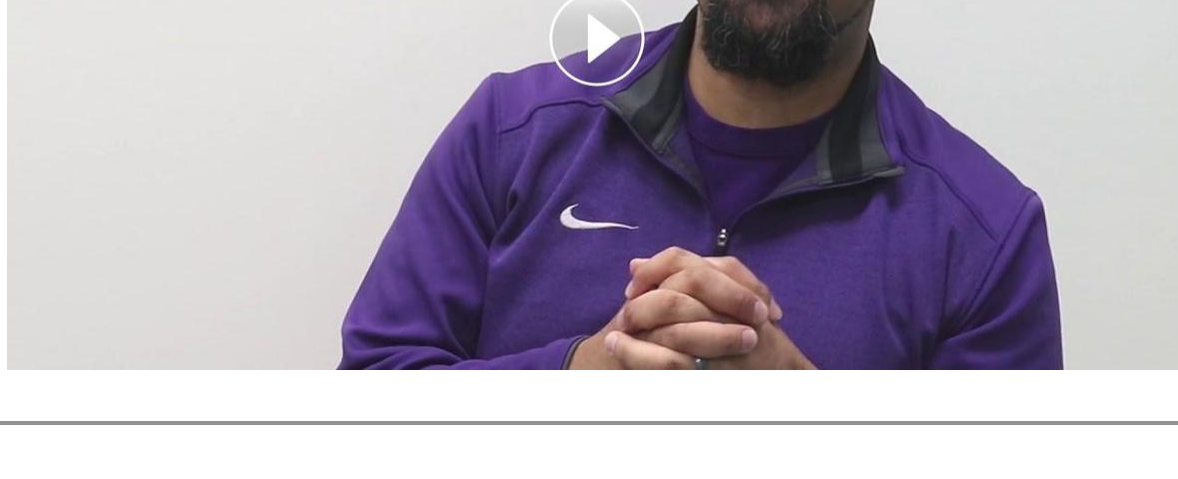
Introducing the YLT Intern

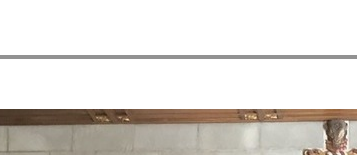

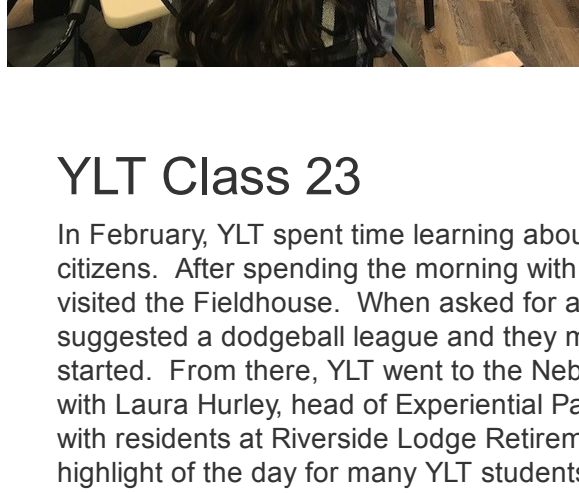

Class 34

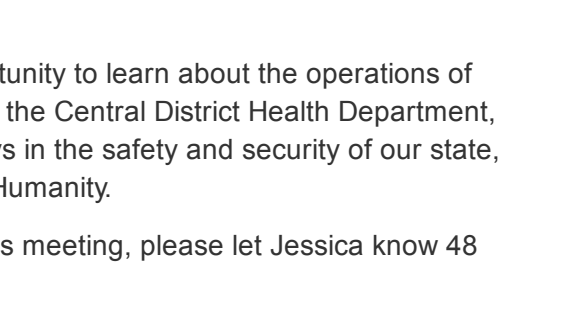
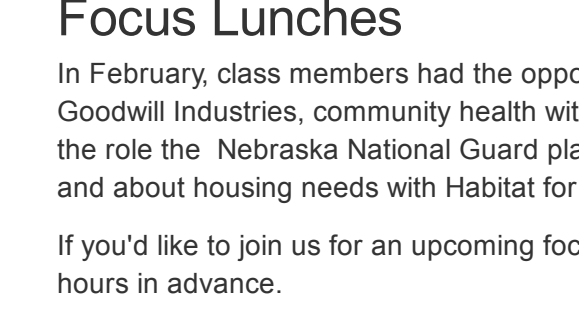

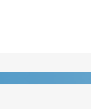
Learn how Servant Leadership and the 9-Box evaluation tool are used to manage the capacity of your team.

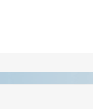

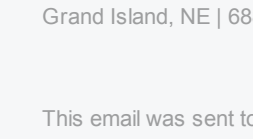
