## Eligibility

- Be enrolled as a student in a Hall County School.
- Be in your junior year of high school during the 2020/21 school year.
- Possess a desire to develop and utilize leadership skills.
- Have an interest in learning more about Hall County leaders, services, and organizations.

### **Program Goals**

- Expand knowledge of Hall County.
- Meet and interact with teens from other Hall County high schools.
- Develop leadership skills.
- Become aware of what important issues leaders must consider.
- Become community builders by doing fun and important projects.

### **General Instructions for Application**

- Complete this application including all written responses, and recommendation letters.
   Application is available online at www.leadershiptomorrow.com.
- Applications must be typed. No handwritten or incomplete applications will be accepted.
- Recommendation letters must emailed by the letter writer, not by the applicant.
- Do not change the margins and do not use smaller than a 12-point font.
- Please DO NOT STAPLE your application but put it in unfolded in a large envelope in the following order:
  - Personal Information
  - Essay Questions
  - Signature Page
- Return (email, mail or drop off at our office) by 4:00pm on April 1<sup>st</sup> to Youth Leadership Tomorrow, 3180 W US HWY 34, Grand Island, NE 68803. Late applications will not be considered.
- Interviews will be held in late April for candidates being considered for acceptance.
- The Youth Leadership Tomorrow Committee will review the applications and all applicants will be notified via email in May.



### **Requirements for Graduation**

- Attend all sessions. The program runs from September through April. Absences will need to be approved.
- Prioritize Youth Leadership Tomorrow sessions by not coming late/leaving early, etc.
- **Support the class** through possible additional community activities (Rotary events, radio/tv advertisements, news interviews, etc.).
- **Help or be on a team for the Freeze Out Games,** which is the annual fundraiser for the Youth Leadership Tomorrow program.
- Help to organize sessions and plan for our guests.
- **Engage with area nonprofits as part of sessions** with the option of additional nonprofit support outside of sessions.

#### Cost

- A \$350.00 tuition is due by Friday, September 4<sup>th</sup>, for those accepted into the program.
- Youth are encouraged to find businesses to sponsor their full or partial participation in the program. A Fundraising 101 Class will be held in early June to help support your fundraising efforts.
- Limited scholarships for up to 50% of the tuition may be available to offset the cost of the program. Email jsabott@leadershiptomorrow.com for more information.
- The Greater Grand Island Community Foundation also has grant opportunities for students who receive free or reduced lunch.

Please do not hesitate to apply due to tuition. There are many ways to cover tuition, including grants and fundraising from local organizations.
